Please contact Lori Breckenridge at 926-4688 if you would like to know the gift cards available.

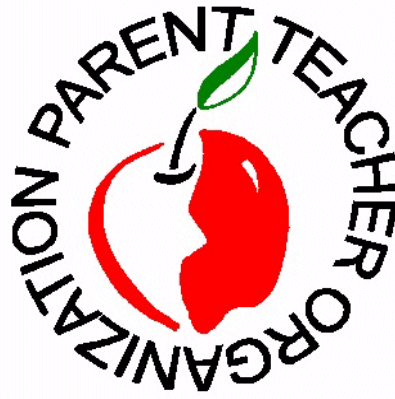
